49.1 The Board received a presentation from the Pro Vice Chancellor Students on the Purpose Coalition Levelling Up Impact Report following points were highlighted:

- the Levelling Up White Paper of February 2022 sets out six focus areas to drive levelling up (physical, human, intangible, financial, social and institution, **a**) charea the University has a part to play in. However, there is a stark omission of reference to universities, especially in relation to human, social and institutional capital.

- the Purpose Coalition brings together businesses, policy makers, charities and universities focussed on working together on 14 levelling up goals orcesteris one of 15 universities in the Coalition. The report maps the University against the 14 goals the presentation highlighted the University's achievements in the areas of Successful school years' and 'Right advice and experiences'.
