The course is designed to help professionals understand the signs and symptoms of mental health issues in children and young people, and how to provide support and signpost to appropriate services.

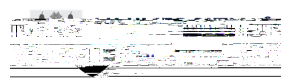

Through adoption of a strengths-based approach with a focus on building on the strengths of children and young people, the course aims to help professionals understand the signs and symptoms of mental health issues and how to provide support and signpost to appropriate services.
